

Trinity Academy Health & Safety Policy

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1. Introduction

At Trinity Academy, the health and safety of our students, staff, and visitors are paramount. This Health & Safety Policy outlines our commitment to providing a secure and healthy environment conducive to learning and personal development. By implementing robust procedures, conducting regular risk assessments, and fostering a culture of safety awareness, we aim to minimize risks, prevent accidents, and ensure the well-being of all members of our school community.

2. Purpose

The purpose of this policy is to:

- Establish clear guidelines and procedures for maintaining health and safety standards throughout the school premises, including classrooms, laboratories, recreational areas, and boarding facilities.
- Define the roles and responsibilities of school management, staff, students, and external stakeholders in ensuring compliance with health and safety regulations.
- Promote a proactive approach to identifying, assessing, and mitigating risks, hazards, and potential emergencies.
- Provide guidance on emergency response protocols, first aid procedures, and health and hygiene practices to safeguard the welfare of individuals on school grounds.

3. Scope

This policy applies to all aspects of school operations, including but not limited to academic activities, extracurricular programs, sports events, residential accommodations, field trips, and transportation services. It encompasses physical, mental, and emotional health considerations, as well as compliance with relevant legislation, standards, and best practices in health and safety management.

4. Responsibilities

Responsibilities for health and safety management at Trinity Academy are distributed as follows:

- School Management: Responsible for establishing and maintaining a safe and healthy school environment, allocating resources for health and safety initiatives, and ensuring compliance with legal and regulatory requirements.
- Staff: Responsible for implementing health and safety policies and procedures in their respective areas of work, identifying and reporting hazards or concerns, and participating in training and awareness programs.

In addition to the school clinic, every boarding house is assigned a house matron who oversees the health and safety needs of students residing in the house. House matrons are trained to address minor health concerns, administer first aid when necessary, and promptly report any medical emergencies to the school clinic or appropriate authorities. This additional layer of support ensures that students' health and safety needs are attended to promptly and effectively, promoting a safe and nurturing living environment within the boarding houses.

17. Laboratory Safety Policies

Trinity Academy is dedicated to providing a safe and conducive environment for students to engage in practical learning experiences in laboratory settings. To ensure the safety of students and staff during laboratory activities, the following safety policies are implemented:
